The programme began with the Karuna Prayer followed by the Welcome Address by Principal, Ms. Aruna Appasamy. Ms. Lakshmi Neelakantan CEO Karuna International, Ms Aruna Appasamy. Ms Rajeswari, Middle School PrincipalMs. Susila Sundaram teachers-in-charge, Ms. Saraswathi, Incharge Karuna club and Ms. Vidya, staff secretary inaugurated the programme by lighting the lamp. The afternoon session began with an inspiring speech by Sri. Dulichand Jain, Chairman Karuna International, on the topic 'Our Mission and Vision'.
