HEALTHY BREAKFAST


Devi Academy conducted an activity 'Start The Day With Healthy Breakfast' in the month of July.


Picnic with Vegetarian diet- 23.08.2012


There is a great need to spread the awareness for preserving the eco system in view of the rampant pollution, de-forestation and urbanization. Trees help to


