Members of our Karuna Kendra are mostly elders aged above 60 years & have a strong & kind desire to do something good for humanity.

Keeping in view the acute shortage of electricity everywhere and 1 to 2 Hrs. Power-Cuts almost every day members of our Karuna Kendra are supplying a few Usha Electrical Cooker of 1 litre costing ₹1100/- to the needy, provided he bears 50% of the cost. Emergency Lighting kits made from used battery from vehicles will be provided at a low cost.

**Exciting Plans by Horticulture Dept. – for those interested in gardening**

For people of A.P. who are interested in gardening particularly vegetables on the roof terrace or to develop a Kitchen Garden, the Horticulture Dept., has exciting plans under the Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana of the Union Agriculture Ministry. The idea is to help people

overcome the shortage of vegetables and the focus is mainly on cities under the Urban Vegetable Initiative.

The nutrition garden can be grown in areas ranging from 25 Sq.m to 250 Sq.m. For those taking up in top terrace, water proofing is required. Otherwise nutritional soil can be spread on a polythene sheet and small bunds can be made to grow the plants. The Applicant & the Horticulture Dept., have to share the cost equally. The Dept. will provide seed/seedlings, vermin- compost and Neem Oil (as as bio-pesticide ) towards its 50% share. As 1708 units have sanctioned for Visakhapatnam, our Kendra is working with GVMC (Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corp.) Urban Community Wing for fresh, homegrown healthy vegetables especially in the ensuing summer.

*The 66 year old nominee Dr.Chiranjee Lal Bagra, Kolkatta has been rendering yeomen service to vegetarianism and non-violence for decades. He holds important responsibilities in various NGOs like Indian Federation of Ahimsa Organizations (Secretary General). He has travelled widely, participated in National & International, Seminars / Conferences and represented India in World Vegetarian Congress thrice at USA, Thailand and Canada etc. He is instrumental in getting cancelled around 60,000 proposed slaughter houses in rural areas. He has authored many books, Vegetarianism in Life, Indian Cattle Wealth, besides editing Vegetarian guide (English Quarterly) and Disha Bodh (Hindi Monthly). He has won a number of awards including National Unity Award (91), Ahimsa International Award (97) & Ahimsa Ratna (2006).*

### **Seminar of Indian Vegetarian Congress**

A Seminar of Indian Vegetarian Congress was organised at AVM Rajeswari Mandapam, Mylapore, Chennai on 6th October, 2012. Prof. B. Ramanathan, Former HOD of History, Presidency College, Chennai and Joint Secretary of Karuna International participated in the 1 day seminar and delivered a talk on the importance of Vegetarianism in today's world. He was also the Judge of the Inter school Poster Competition. More than 25 schools in the city participated.

### **Ahimsa Summit – Exhibition On Ahimsa**

Under the inspiration and guidance by Param Pujya Jain Acharya Shri Rajyash Soreshwarji Maharaj, the one month long Ahimsa Summit was organized by Karuna International in association with Sri Vepery Swetamber Murti Pujak Jain Sangh. The exhibition at Ahimsa Nagari, Goutam Kiran, Vepery, Chennai from 26.10.2012 to 02.11.2012. was a part of the summit. This exhibition was developed and presented by Sri Vinesh Mamania Mumbai.

The main objective of this exhibition was to draw the attention of visitors to save animals, to prevent environment imbalance, global warming and universal peace. It was also to muster support to fight against abortion, leather products, animals tested products and animal origin food products.

The well made exhibits in the exhibition drew the attention of all visitors. All the stalls were very informative illustrating the principles of vegetarianism, animal care, cruelty to animals, perils of abortion, falling birth rate of females, advantages of various vegetarian food and using animals for medical research.

Various stalls in the exhibition emphasized the following ideas through posters, charts etc. - we should discourage use of brushes made of animals bristles and also should not wear dresses made of animal skin and fur. We should not use tiger skin or tiger teeth and purses made of snakes skins. We should not use or encourage use of animals for entertainment as in a circus, animal fight programmes. We should not use articles made of ivory, thereby saving elephants.

We should motivate all our friends, relatives and neighbors to eat vegetarian food, by explaining the advantages and nutritional values of vegetarian food. All animals slaughtering should be stopped; killing animals and birds for food should be put an end. Children should be taught the nutritional value vegetarian food items and different food choices available.

For making shampoos, lipsticks, creams etc. animals are used for testing. Let us not use powders, creams, and shampoos etc. tested on animals. Bio medical research on animals and birds should be stopped. Our ladies should stop buying pearls because to produce one natural pearl 1,00,000 oysters are killed. We should understand that 50,000 whales are killed every year to get materials required for production of lipstick.

Every one of us should take steps to protect endangered species of animals, fish, birds, insects etc. in order to maintain the ecological balance. Female children are important to preserve balance between male and female population. Abortion should be discouraged. It was shocking to know that one million abortions take place every year in India. Every child is a wanted child and it should see the light of the day.

Global warming and ozone layer depletion are the major problems of this century. Unless effective steps are taken to reduce air, water and gas pollution the future generations will be affected much. The ecological balance between human, animal bird and insects should be maintained in order to have a healthy and safe earth to live in. More and more tree saplings should be planted and cutting of trees should be minimized.

Four CDs covering leather, cosmetics, pollution, saving water, no to cutting trees etc. were screened in the exhibition.
